

A Plastic-Free Alternative:

Switching to Reusable Speculums

Why Switch?



Environment

Reusable stainless steel speculums outperform their single-use acrylic counterparts in terms of landfill waste, carbon emissions, air quality, and fossil fuel depletion.



Cost

Disposable speculums can be purchased in Alberta (2022) for approximately \$2.29/unit.

Medium metal speculums cost \$26.80 each. The price per unit for a reusable speculum with an estimated 50 uses per year for a 10 year lifetime would be 5¢ per use before disinfection cost.



Safety

Stainless steel speculums can improve sustainability while maintaining clinical utility and safety standards.

Not all disposable speculums are listed as sterile.

How are they cleaned?

Stainless steel speculums need, at minimum, a high-level disinfection, if not sterilization between each pelvic exam use. They must be sterilized for use in IUD insertions. See the AHS sterilization guidelines here.

If you are considering purchasing a steam-sterilizing system in clinic, there is a <u>CPSA checklist</u> of criteria to consider to ensure it will meet requirements.

To maintain safety standards in the use of a sterilizing device, follow the <u>CPSA requirements</u> for the medical device reprocessing.

To further reduce waste, disposable sterilizing pouches can be replaced with reusable pouches. These can be used a minimum of 200 times before replacing. The reusable options from Enviropouch have been recommended by the Hamilton Family Health Team Green Initiative and can be purchased online.
