M-CENTOR score for strep pharyngitis

M UST be ≥3 years old	
C ough absent	+1
Exudates/swelling present	+1
Nodes palpable (anterior cervical)	+1
Temperature >38 C	+1
Often <15 years old	+1
Rarely >45 years old	-1



Score ≤1

(Risk of strep 1-10%)

No further testing or antibiotics

Score 2-3

(Risk of strep 11-35%)

Throat culture/rapid antigen test recommended

Score ≥4

(Risk of strep is 51-53%)

Perform swab/rapid test. Consider empiric therapy

PODS criteria for acute bacterial rhinosinusitis

Facial Pain, Pressure or fullness
Nasal Obstruction
Nasal purulence or discoloured Discharge
Hyposmia/anosmia (Smell)



Obstruction or Discharge plus ≥1 other PODS symptom must be present for ≥7 days without improvement for the diagnosis of acute bacterial rhinosinusitis.
